How will our Garden grow? Plans for SBBG in the next decade presented by Dr. Steve Windhager, Executive Director, Santa Barbara Botanic Garden



It's been six years since Steve Windhager took over the Botanical Garden, and what a difference he's made. The organization's

controversies, financial troubles, and neighboring unhappiness are things of the past, and the new John C. Pritzlaff Conservation Center, an 11,500-square-foot facility, opened on July 13 as the new educational face of the garden. It's a strong sign of forward momentum for the Mission Canyon institution, which is the oldest botanical garden in North America that's focused squarely on native plants and has been a world leader in conservation since the 1960s.

Steve began his career as from a theoretical bent, obtaining a B.A. in Philosophy from Texas A&M University. He then proceeded to the University of North Texas, completing his Masters focusing on

Environmental Ethics. Steve's Master's thesis focused on the philosophical aspects of the practice of ecological restoration. In the process of completing this work, he became so interested in restoration that he not only wanted to study it, he chose to *do* it, and began his Ph.D. work in environmental science focusing on restoration ecology.

A national leader in sustainable development and ecological restoration, Steve helped develop, and was the first Director of the Sustainable Sites Initiative (SITES), a joint project of the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center and the United States Botanic Garden and the American Society of Landscape Architects. SITES provides sustainable design guidelines and ratings for assessing the sustainability of landscapes. Steve remains on the Technical Core Committee of SITES. He has a total of 600 square feet of planting bed. He uses less then half the water that an average Goleta household uses.

One of two very dangerous pests has been found in Montecito. The one found is Kuroshio shot hole borer. This, and Polyphegas shot hole borer, attack hundreds of common landscape trees and shrubs, killing any susceptible to the fusarium that the beetle carries with it. The insect attacks Castor Bean and uses it as a host to spread, so removal of Castor Bean is key in slowing the spread of these dangerous insects.
