Lotusland's Sustainable Horticulture Program

presented by Corey Welles,
Plant Healthcare Coordinator
Ganna Walska Lotusland

Corey Welles will discuss Lotusland's Sustainable Horticulture Program with an emphasis on biocontrol and the new insectary garden at Lotusland.



Corey is a well-known horticulturist and lecturer on sustainable landscaping in Santa Barbara California. Born in San Diego California, he has

always been fascinated with ecology and one day hoped to be a creative force in environmental work.

In 1982 he moved up to Santa Barbara and graduated from Santa Barbara City College with his A.S. in Environmental Horticulture. His passion for biology and ecology lead him to take further class work in entomology, ornithology, marine biology,

zoology, and leaf litter analysis of Santa Cruz Island. He made his career choice early at 27 and for 26 years has perfected his approach to environmental gardening. Corey has given regular training seminars on sustainable landscaping in the Southern California area. He is certified in compost tea production-a relatively new technology popular at many botanic gardens. Currently he is Plant Healthcare Coordinator of Ganna Walska Lotusland where he implements sustainable horticulture techniques to the rare plant collections.

Bruce Van Dyke passed away on November 9, 2016 at the age of 94, surrounded by his wife Dorchen and other family members. Bruce graduated from UCLA with a degree in Sub-tropical Horticulture in 1948 and

moved to the Santa Barbara area to teach horticulture at <u>Santa Barbara</u> <u>City College</u> (then called Santa Barbara Junior College). In 1954 he began teaching adult education courses and continued doing so for the next 42 years. A year prior he had also started a plant grafting business, a skill for which he has long since been recognized by all who have known him. Many of us have Bruce Van Dyke grafted avocado, stone fruit, citrus, camellia and tropical fruiting trees in our gardens.

Starting in 1964 and working for 33 years, Bruce was the Garden Editor of the Santa Barbara News Press. During this time he also worked with civic leader Pearl Chase to organize garden tours and later continued these efforts with the Santa Barbara Beautiful organization. He also was a longtime member of the board of the Santa Barbara Botanic Garden, a

Commissioner and worked part
time on the estate of Madame
Ganna Walska, before it was
known as Lotusland, and later
volunteered in this wonderland
when it became a botanic
garden. He was active in the

Master Gardeners program and spoke at meetings of all of the local gardening clubs and societies. He was served as the manager of

the Santa Barbara International Orchid Show from 1974 until 1995.

Bruce received the Bouquet of the Year Award from our society in 1984, honoring his work and the promotion of horticulture in the area. In 1994 a tribute dinner was held in his honor at Santa Barbara City College

commemorating his many horticultural achievements. At this meeting Bruce received a Letter of Commendation from the City of Santa Barbara for his efforts to beautify the city. In 2007 he received the Heritage Oak Award from Santa Barbara Beautiful for his numerous contributions to our community. By Randy Baldwin.
